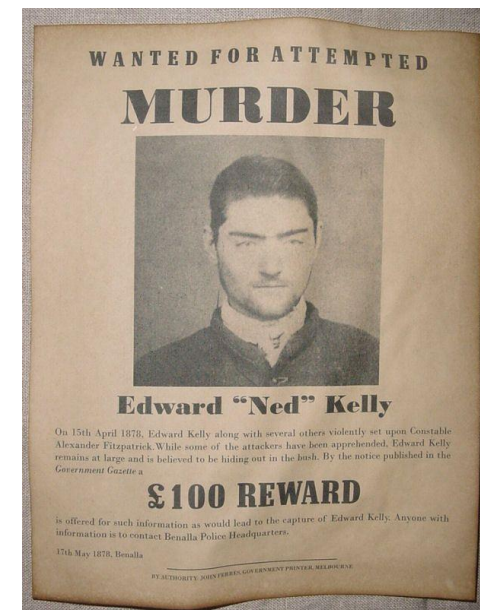
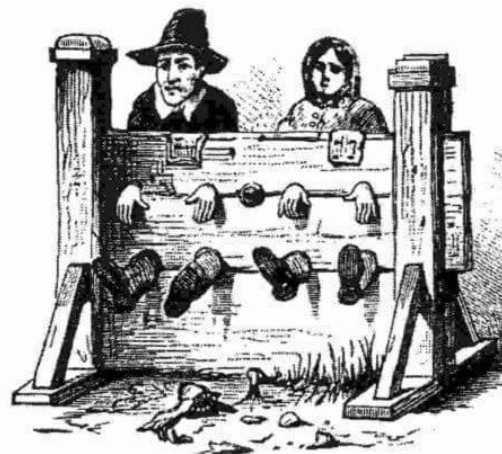

- Historical Investigation of your choice!

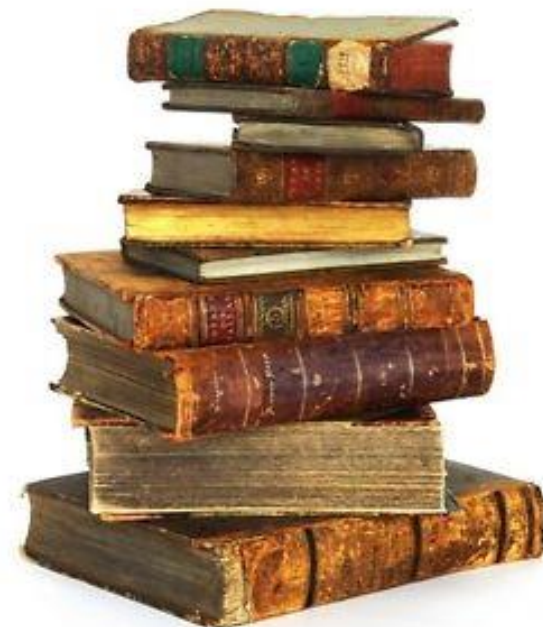
